As a student in the Faculty of Business administration, he has maintained a grade point average of 81.13%, and has been named a three-time Academic All-Canadian as a result. He is on track to complete his Business Administration degree in December 2014, and earlier this month at the University of Regina Athletic Awards, he was named the recipient of the President's Award as the student-athlete who best combines excellence in academics and athletics at our University.

Jeremy is an intelligent and dedicated young man who I know has a bright future ahead of him in the world of business – something you will recognize immediately when you meet him. Right now, however, I believe he should be competing for Canada as an Olympic high jumper. He is only nine centimetres away from this once-in-a-lifetime goal, and with our help, he can achieve it and represent all of us with pride at the 2016 Olympics, just as he has done for the University of Regina over the past five years.
